



THE AUSTRALIAN BANANA GROWERS' COUNCIL'S MORT JOHNSTON SCHOLARSHIP	
Scholarship Aim	The purpose of this scholarship is to support students with a strong interest and potential involvement with the Australian Banana industry in their third or fourth (honours) year of studies at the University of Queensland. The aim is to offer students the opportunity to develop work experience at the Australian Banana industry and build a solid foundation of network.
Scholarship Value and Duration	(1) The School of Agriculture and Food Sciences will award one scholarship per a year on the recommendation of the Head. (2) The value of the scholarship is \$5,000, for each year in which it is held. (3) The scholarship will be paid in two installments in the year of awarding.
Eligibility Criteria	An applicant is eligible for the scholarship, if the applicant – (a) submits an application to the Head, by the closing date for applications; and (b) is enrolled full-time and has completed a minimum of 32 units of an - agriculture related program; or - has commenced honours year in relevant program; and (c) is an Australian citizen or a permanent resident; and (d) holds a class C drivers licence; and (e) does not hold another scholarship that the Head considers to be similar.
Selection Process	(1) For the selection process, the Head must establish a selection committee, comprising- (a) the Head, or nominee, as chair of the committee; and (b) one representative of the Australian Banana Growers' Council; and (c) academic staff members (max of two) currently teaching in the relevant (2) The scholarship is awarded to the applicant showing greatest merit as demonstrated by- (a) academic achievement in courses undertaken during the first four semesters of the relevant program; and (b) personal qualities, including leadership potential; and (c) strength of interest that the applicant demonstrates in completing at least one period of vacation employment at a banana business in North Queensland; and

	<p>(d) who have demonstrated an interest and the capacity to make a worthwhile contribution to the development of the Australian banana industry</p> <p>(e) any other matter that the selection committee considers to be relevant to the applicant's future success in environmental science profession.</p> <p>(3) The selection committee may decide to interview short-listed applicants, and a higher preference is given to section 4(2:b-d).</p>
Conditions of Scholarship	<p>(1) The recipient may hold the scholarship for one year, subject to the recipient -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) providing a short written report (no more than 4 pages) on main learnings from their work experience to ABGC noting areas where there is opportunity for a young person coming into the industry; and (b) a short video on why the banana industry has a strong future; and (c) participating in an interview for publication in <i>Australian Bananas</i> magazine and UQ media; and (d) acknowledging the support of the Mort Johnston Scholarship and the ABGC in all printed material; and (e) continuing to be enrolled full-time in the relevant program; and (f) achieving a GPA of at least 4 for each semester of study; and (g) conducting themselves in a professional manner while performing any ambassadorial role or duties of vacation employment. <p>(2) If a recipient fails to satisfy Scholarship Rule (1), the recipient must show cause to the Head, why the scholarship should not be cancelled.</p>
Application Process	<p>Please complete all sections of the application form including signatures and ensure that supporting documentation is attached. Incomplete and late applications will not be considered.</p> <p>The Selection Committee may decide to interview short-listed applicants, and their determination will be considered final; no further communication will be entered into. All applicants will be notified in writing of the outcome of their application. Successful recipients may be required to participate in promotional activities associated with the award of the Australian Banana Growers' Council's Mort Johnston Scholarship.</p>

2. Academic Merit	Evidence of academic merit will be a GPA of at least 4 in the undergraduate degree being undertaken with the School of Agriculture and Food Sciences.

Strength of Interest in banana industry	<p>Applicants are required to demonstrate their commitment to the industry and leadership potential by providing a written document of no more than one page addressing the following :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Your interest in Australian agriculture and in particular the banana industry and its future - Commitment to your studies and in particular specific areas of interest (e.g. soil biology, supply chains)
